All India Federation of the Deaf (AIFD) is an apex body of different affiliated organizations of the deaf spread all over India and serves the deaf community in elevating their living quality. Globally, it works with World Federation of the Deaf (WFD), which is in turn affiliated to UNESCO, UNICEF and ILO of United Nations Organization (UNO). The federation was set up on 22nd December 1955 with an aim to unite the Deaf all over India. The organization has been presented number of awards at National and State level.

The All India Federation of the Deaf has been lucky to be headed by eminent social workers as its Presidents and VPs. Mrs. Hanna Sen. was our first President, followed by Smt. Sucheta Kripalani, Shri I.K. Gujral, Smt. Savitri Nigam MP, General K.M. Cariappa, Bhai Mohan Singh and Shri S.C. Chhabra. Mrs. B. Tarabhai was our chief advisor for many years. Our present President Kum. Surrendar Saini has served AIFD for 45 years, and despite her advancing age she is still guiding the affairs of the Federation.

Kum. Saini was met by some deaf persons when she was working as Vice President of New Delhi Municipal Committee, and helped the deaf to get license of Cycle Stand near Regal Cinema, New Delhi. She was instrumental to get Smt. Indira Gandhi as Chief Guest at International Day of the Deaf held at Bal Bhawan, New Delhi. Kum. Saini worked hard to get a piece of land allotted to AIFD at Shaheed Jeet Singh Marg, South Delhi, where our prestigious Multipurpose Training Centre for the Deaf and a Hostel have been constructed through MES, that has provided training and jobs to a large number of adult deaf boys and girls.

For socio-economic mainstreaming of the deaf, AIFD has promoted Multipurpose Training Centre for the Deaf (MPTCD) at Delhi, which renders vocational training with residential facility for the Deaf boys and girls. Projects of AIFD are duly recognized by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India, which provides grants for this purpose.

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Multipurpose Training Centre for the Deaf (ITI Pvt.)

Multipurpose Training Centre for the Deaf (popularly known as MPTCD) located at 12-13, Shaheed Jeet Singh Marg (Qutub Institutional Area), New Delhi-110067, is a vocational training centre for the deaf boys and girls. The Centre has two separate buildings on its 1.5 acres campus. There are also open spaces for future expansion and playground.

Deaf students aged between 14-30 years are offered training in different trades. Presently, it runs 4 main trades, e.g. Computer-Graphics, (PGR & PGA), Photography, Fitter & Turner and Sewing Technology . Each trade is subdivided in two batches for fresher and advanced courses with duration of one year for each batch. The 1st year Refresher courses (one year) are mostly for confidence building in the trade along with linguistic mainstreaming. 2nd year Advanced courses are kept equivalent to ITI curriculum. So, the total list of batches is as follows:

- 1) Sewing Technology (Refresher)**
- 2) Sewing Technology (Advanced, ITI Affiliated)**
- 3) Photography (Refresher)**
- 4) Photography (Advanced, ITI Affiliated)**
- 5) Fitter & Turner (Refresher)**
- 6) Fitter & Turner (Advanced with ITI Curriculum)**
- 7) Computer Basics & Printing Graphic (Refresher)**
- 8) Printing Graphic (Advanced Level)**

Admission is conducted with prior notification and publicity. The printing course has been re-oriented by amalgamating with computerized techniques. Sewing Technology and Photography courses got recognized by National Council of Vocational Training (ITI), Govt. of India. Initiative is going on for reorganization of other courses too. Currently, the digital techniques have been added with the photography curriculum to make the training more contemporary. Academic season starts from August every year. Candidates seeking admission are required to qualify the screening test conducted by MPTCD and according to directive of ITI authority, Ministry of Technical Education, Delhi. Candidate who has passed at least 8th standard and 14 years of age is eligible for admission. Special cases are treated subject to individual merit. The Projects of AIFD are duly recognized by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India, and it provides grants for this purpose. Since its inception (1977), MPTCD has produced more than 3070 boys and girls and many of them have been gainfully employed in different parts of India. For safety and security AIFD also installed modern automated firefighting system in MPTCD.

Question papers for Final Examination are conducted by external examiners from ITI, INSDOC, etc. The Sewing Technology (Tailoring) and Photographer trades have been affiliated to National Council for Vocational Training (NCVT). During last five years, the candidates have come out with 100% success, and have secured more than 82% marks in average in practical examination. One more course, Fitter Trade, is in the pipeline for recognition of

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NCVT. AIFD feels sure of the possibility of their gainful employment because of the ITI recognition in future.

Sports, Excursions & Cultural Activities

Overall performance of MPTCD in sports was satisfactory but some individual's performance was remarkable. MPTCD students qualified in National & International Level competitions in Cricket, Football, Volleyball and Chess beside other games. The students of MPTCD were participated in silent Chess Championship on 19th and 20th November 2016 organize by Silent Sports Promotion Society and awarded with certificates. Kum. Jyoti Prabha a student of Sewing Technology stood 3rd in Girls category and awarded with a certificate of merit.

Every year institute conducts excursions and outing. This year due to financial problem and schedule for ITI examination no students of MPTCD took part in summer adventure camp organized by Manav, a social organization.. The students of MPTCD participated in various cultural contests in Delhi organized by YMCA Nizamudden on 8.9.2016 and awarded with three 1st prizes by Saindhy Shakher Singh a student of Sewing Technology in Rangoli, Painting and Solo dance. Beside Sh Saindhy Shakher Singh, Sh Surava Verma awarded with 1st prize in Solo dance, another 5 students were awarded with 3rd prize in Comedy show. 10 students were participated in dance and comedy show in Delhi women Medical center at Zumrathpur on November 2016

Classroom Facilities

Every trade being trained by the instructors of that specified field as per NCVT norms and special skill training is being provided by the professionals. Students are also taken for field visit to gain experience. For practical's, institute provides instrumental support and students are being taken care of individually.

Sewing Technology: In tailoring section each student uses individual set of instruments including sewing machine both manual, motorized and electronic. Institute is planning to introduce modern computerized machine for skill training.

Photography: Photography students get opportunity to handle different types of cameras from vintage models to modern digital technology, including handling different photo-software. Photography students also learn to do graphic works related to photographer profession, beside traditional analog/we process. Digital photography and Video photography is also in the course.

Computer: Computer students learn the basics of computer, Data-entry and later profession related graphic-printing using modern software. Students are also allowed practicing extra time after class hours under guidance of the instructor.

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Turner-Fitter-Welder: Institute runs a unique combined technical course of Turner-Fitter-Welder for two years following ITI curriculums. Institute workshop has two types of lathe, drilling and grinding machines for tool making. Welding training is provided on the fourth quarter of training after students' concept is clear about metallurgy. Total protection measure is taken during the training. This combined course attracts numbers of small tools making factories and a good number of students from this trade are employed in the industry.

Employability Skill: NCVT inducted 'Employability Skill' and 'IT' in both semesters for ongoing courses of ITI level. MPTCD is also inducted the same as per directive of NCVT for which some guest faculties were appointed on part time basis on minimum honorarium for train the students.

Hostel Facility (Hostel for the Deaf)

AIFD runs 'Hostel for the Deaf' located at MPTCD campus for both boys and girls with separate enclosure. Students from far-flung areas can use the facility for study purpose only. Hostel has hot and cold water facility for students. It has separate common room fitted with TV. Sports facilities for boarders are also providing. Yoga classes are organized time to time. Every year on average 40/50 students, including girls, utilize the facility.

Medical Check Up

AIFD organizes medical check-up camps at MPTCD campus. Including eye check-up. Regular medical check-up at MPTCD was conducted by Dr. Chandra Mohan Saini in voluntary capacity. Dr. Saini is helping for many years. A

Free dental Check up camp was also organized by Dr Saket Saurav Singh brother of our special faculty Ms Swata at MPTCD during the year 2016-17

Scholarship

Every year on average 60% students benefitted from the schemes. Beside ministry, private organizations like Jindal Foundation, Lions Club, other philanthropists regularly support our students for their education and study materials which individually comes around ` . 9000/- per student annually.

Approximately an amount of Rs. 1, 84,000/- has been awarded among 75% of students in form of scholarship/sponsorship/award from Govt., & other generous donors during 2012-13.

During the year 2013, Rs.2000/- each as scholarship of 22 students of MPTCD were awarded by Smt. Meira Kumar, Hon'ble Speaker of Lok Sabha during the year 2013-14 for continuing their study at MPTCD. Lioness Club – Sukarama, Gurgaon, is providing study support to two BPL students this year, Miss Meera Khanna daughter of Ms Neelam Khanna Ex President of Lioness Club, Sukarm providing study support to a minority student of MPTCD during the year

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2014-15. Vice President of AIFD, Mr. Tejlal Bharti donated a high power exhaust fan for the use of hostel canteen in the year 2013-14. No cash award and Govt. Scholarship received during the year 2014-15 and 2015-16. However, Ms. Lalita Manchand, Mr. Ravi Manchanda along with Ms Jayshree Arora President of Lioness Club Sukarma, Gurgaon, donated 42 blankets and personally handed over the blankets to all students of MPTCD and some needy staffs of MPTCD in a function held at MPTCD during the year 2014-15. Miss Meera Khanna daughter of Mrs Neelem Khanna Ex president of Lioness Club, Sukerma, Gurgaon, A potential doner providing study support entirely for Two BPL students name Sh Dharmender, a student of Computer and Miss Bobita kumara and student of Sewing Technology for two successive years 2015-16 and 2016-17, Mrs Prem Krishanan, Ms Kinnarid India Trust, 111-1, Jorbagh has donated entire study support to Miss Pooja Mehta for the years 2016-17 & 2017-18.

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Certificate & Diploma Distribution

Every year, AIFD organize Certificate & Diploma Distribution Ceremony and eminent personalities are invited to grace the occasion. In 2016, on 15th July the function took place at MPTCD Campus. Student's also staged a cultural show. Certificate & Diplomas were distributed among the 17 pass out students. Our Chief Guest La Rani Seth, President Lioness Club of Sukarma, Gurgaon and our Vice President Sh Tejlal Bharti ji distributed the Diploma or Certificate along with other distinguished Guests and members. Due to illness our President Kum. Surrendar Saini could not attend the ceremony but she conveyed her wishes to the students Chief Guest, Guest of honour and members of AIFD.

Placement Section

AIFD runs a placement section through which qualified deaf people are employed in various Govt. and Private Organizations. The placement unit pursues the pass outs of MPTCD students for suitable job. Govt. jobs are hard to get and their employment system is different, its works directly a through advertisement, vocational rehabilitation Centre's and Special Employment Exchanges. AIFD on the other hand tries to reach private establishments and industries, where we are able to get a number of deaf employed. During the year 2015-16 about three students from MPTCD were got placement in same private organization. . During the year 2014-15 four students from MPTCD were got placement in Private sectors during the year 2013 -14, eleven students from MPTCD were got placement in private sectors. During 2012-13, seven of our students being absorbed by an ISO certified Silver foil Manufacturer Company, located in Patparganj, Delhi. In the year 2016-17 AIFD organized a selection campus at MPTCD on 27.02.2017 and informed all our passed out students by telephonic message and other source of communication to attend the selection campus, as three deferent company after approaching them personally by us are agreed to select our deaf students in their respected company by way of interview and date was fixed for 27.02.2017, all necessary arrangements were made. On the day of interview three company namely 1) Flexituff International Limited, Kashipur, Uttarakhand. 2) Soda bottle openerwala Khan Market, New Delhi & 3) Silver foil Limited, NOIDA arrived here and about 40 passed students along with their parents attend the interview. It is very happy to inform that all the students have been selected in all three companies 1) Flexituff International Limited selected 22 candidates out of which 20 students have already been joined and happy with the job, the company told me that they will absorbed our students in near future and their door is open for our students for another two years.2) Soda bottle openerwala, Khan Market selected 6 students out of which 5 candidates have already been joined their job and they are very happy for these job the company has assured me that they will offer more job to our students in near future, 3) Silver foil selected 7 candidates, offer of appointments will be received by the candidates at their home address. This is a remarkable achievement. We have full fill all formalities, all were happy for this outstanding event. Presently a negotiation is going on with other placement agencies and some private companies for placement and employment. Due to non receipt of Govt.grant for placement section in Central Office, the placement is badly affected and no placement staff is available at present,

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however, we are trying our level best for placement of the passed out students from our limited sources from MPTCD.

Sign Language Course

AIFD has started Sign Language Training Course in its own campus. Deaf students coming from different places having different signing system are introduced to the standard signs that the course promotes. Hearing persons are also trained to become Sign Language interpreters. AIFD is now collaborating with Ali Yavar Jung National Institute for the Hearing Handicapped to start full time and short term courses at MPTCD campus.

Marriage Bureau & General Counseling

AIFD has a Marriage Counseling section in its Central Office (Near R.K. Ashram Metro Station) and help matchmaking among deaf. Counseling team also helps to resolve the differences in emotional cases.

Deaf Youth Forum

It has been planned to organize a Deaf Youth Forum under AIFD. The Rules and Regulations have been framed and discussed at the last meeting of E.C. It was decided to circulate the draft rules to affiliated organizations to give their suggestions. The Circular already been sent to all affiliated members for their comments for implementation of the rules and regulation of Deaf Youth Forum and its registration. The same is awaited. Further action will be taken after due consideration of the reports submitted by affiliated members and then the case will be finally decided.

Observation of Flag Week

AIFD observes Flag Week as a part of awareness programme on the first week of February since it was formed. This year 59th Flag Week was observed. Under the leadership of President, AIFD delegates pinned flag-stickers to President of India, Vice President of India, Minister of Social Justice of Delhi and many others. During the flag week, an amount of Rs...../- approx. was collected through Boxes and other donations.

A number of resource persons and organizations have generously contributed in cash and equipments. Among the individuals, mention may be made that Sita Ram Jindal Foundation and Trust Rs..... as grant/donation, NDMC Rs. as grant. And Sh Subraminium Chairman, Indian Wind Energy Association donated Rs 1, 00,000/- for the welfare of the students of MPTCD on the occasion of his father's 100 years birth centenary.

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Financial Issues

Govt. grants are far from sufficient to meet even fraction of AIFD's ongoing cost of the programmes. Therefore; AIFD largely depends on public donations. But donations and Govt. grants are drying-up day by day, which lead to acute shortage of fund. This year AIFD struggled to collect as much as possible by reaching to large number of people. Moreover, due to court cases finalization of minimum wages to the staff as per Delhi state minimum wages act, the AIFD is now paying minimum wages to the staff working at offices of MPTCD and AIFD, thus increasing the financial burden a lot. The Govt. grant is not at all sufficient to meet up even 30% of the wages to the staff. The govt. grant not been received by this office for last 5 years and for which we are facing acute shortage of funds. Therefore adequate funds have to be raised to run the organization smoothly for welfare of the deaf people. Therefore, AIFD appeals to all members and like-minded people to donate generously for this organization to overcome the financial problem faced by it.

AIFD recognizes the cooperation of its staff and members in keeping its programmes running at a satisfactory level even with interruption of regular pay within the organization. AIFD thanks the donors, like-minded trusts, for their generous donations both in cash or kind for running the welfare activities.

International Day of the Deaf

AIFD has observed International Day of the Deaf every year for disseminating and creating awareness about the problems and facilities for the hearing handicapped people of India. This day is observed throughout the world on last Sunday of September.

On this occasion, AIFD organized various sports and cultural programmes as a mark of the celebration. Students from various Deaf schools in Delhi and surrounding areas participated in the same. AIFD also organized a painting competition for different age groups of the deaf students but due to lack of funds the International Day of the Deaf for this year is postponed.

AIFD Trust

Federation has formally set up AIFD Trust to safeguard all its movable and immovable assets as per its constitution. The Trust body met several times to advise the activities of the Federation. The trust also looks after the development related to its assets.

Deaf Advance 2012 at Bhubaneswar, Odisha

The Deaf Advance 2012 was held at Bhubaneswar, Odisha, from 2nd to 4th November 2012, by the Orissa Association of the Deaf, under the aegis of All India Federation of the Deaf that was a great success. It was resolved to hold such conference every year at different places of the country but no one has yet come forward to take responsibility to host such meets. As and when

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any deaf organization will host such type of conference in future may please be intimated to AIFD.

Future Programmes

AIFD wants to extend its activities by adding some more projects to its existing projects. These are as follows:-

- 9) Expansion of the constructed area of MPTCD.

Some significant moments of AIFD in brief

- 1959 : First International Flag Week started with blessing of Dr. Rajendra Prasad, President of India, and Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru, Prime Minister of India.
- 1960 : First Vocational Training Centre for Photography was started which was merged with MPTCD later in 1970.
- 1962 : Printing Press for the Deaf Institute was set up.
- 1965 : First National Deaf Sports Meet for promotion of All India Sports Council of the Deaf. Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri, Prime Minister of India was the Chief Guest.
- 1970 : (i) Shri. V.V. Giri, Vice-President of India inaugurated 3rd Congress of AIFD.
(ii) Foundation Stone of Multipurpose Training Centre for the Deaf (MPTCD) was laid by Shri V.V. Giri.

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- 1973 : Smt. Indira Gandhi, Prime Minister of India, inaugurated International Day of the Deaf.
- 1975 : Free Hearing Aids distribution programmed started for hearing impaired and hard of hearing people of India (continuous).
- 1976 : Placement Section, sponsored by the Dept. of Social Welfare, Govt. of India was started in AIFD to provide job to eligible deaf boys and girls.
- 1977 : Printing press for deaf started at the basement of MPTCD and arrangement for training in Tailoring, Photography, Turner & Fitter.
- 1980 : Inauguration of Silver Jubilee Celebrations of AIFD by Shri M. Hidayatullah, Vice-President of India.
- 1983 : Grant started for MPTCD from Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India.
- 1991 : AIFD starts High-tech Computer Training to the Deaf.
- 1995 : (i) Hosts 6th International Conference of Asia Pacific Meet of World Federation of the Deaf (WFD).
(ii) The PWD Act 1995 was enacted. Before that, strong lobby, networking with NGOs, parliamentarians and social activists in different spheres were done by the AIFD continuously for more than a decade.
- 1997 : 40th International Day of the Deaf was celebrated. In fact, it is celebrated every year in the month of September.
- 1998 : On 26th January, Republic Day Parade, AIFD took part in organizing and representing for Disability Tableau in the March Past.
- 2000 : Relentless lobby and advocacy finally materialized Bill for Persons with Disability (PWD).
- 2002 : Cutting & Sewing Section of AIFD got recognized by Industrial Training Institute (ITI).
- 2004 : Photography Section of AIFD got recognized by Industrial Training Institute (ITI).
- 2005 : Visit of MPTCD by Smt. Gursharan Kaur (wife of Dr. Manmohan Singh, Prime Minister of India).

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- 2006 : Visit of MPTCD by Shri B. L. Joshi, Lt. Governor of Delhi.
- 2007 : (i) Shri Yoganand Shastri, Minister for Social Welfare, Delhi, inaugurated 50th International Day of the Deaf. He was deputed by Chief Minister of Delhi, Smt. Sheila Dikshit ji, who was scheduled to visit MPTCD but could not spare time that day.
(ii) AIFD deputed two delegates, Shri D.P. Sahay and Shri Suresh Ahuja, to participate in 15th World Congress of the World Federation of the Deaf Madrid, Spain in July 2007.

(iv) Cultural Team of Deaf from Pakistan visited Delhi during May 2008 and they put up performance jointly with Indian Team of Deaf artists at Shri Ram Centre for Performing Arts which was attended by hundreds of deaf and hearings. The Pakistan Team was given a Reception at MPTCD. The High Commissioner of Pakistan attended.
- 2009: Visit of Shri J. Veeraraghwan, Director of Bhartiya Vidya Bhawan and Shri Ashok Pradhan, Advisor as Chief Guests for Certificate Distribution Ceremony in July 2009.
- 2010: Visit of La Celine Aziz, President Lioness Club of Sukorma, Gurgaon as Chief Guest for Certificate Distribution Ceremony in July 2010.
- 2011: (i) Certificate Distribution Ceremony for the year 2011 was held at MPTCD in the month of July. La Celine Aziz, Ex-President of Lioness Club of Sukorma, Gurgaon as Chief Guest for Certificate Distribution Ceremony.
(ii) 54th International Day of the Deaf was celebrated at MPTCD on 24th September. Mrs. Vishana Narang, Sr. Professor of JNU was the Chief Guest. Children from various schools of deaf in Delhi participated in Sports and Cultural events.
(iii) Deaf Youth Assembly was celebrated on 25th September at Delhi University Auditorium. Over 400 to 500 persons attended.
